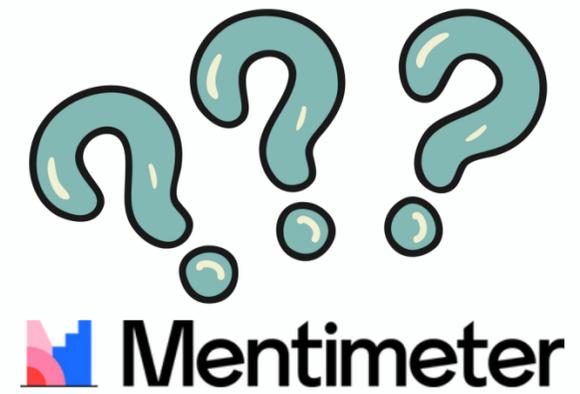

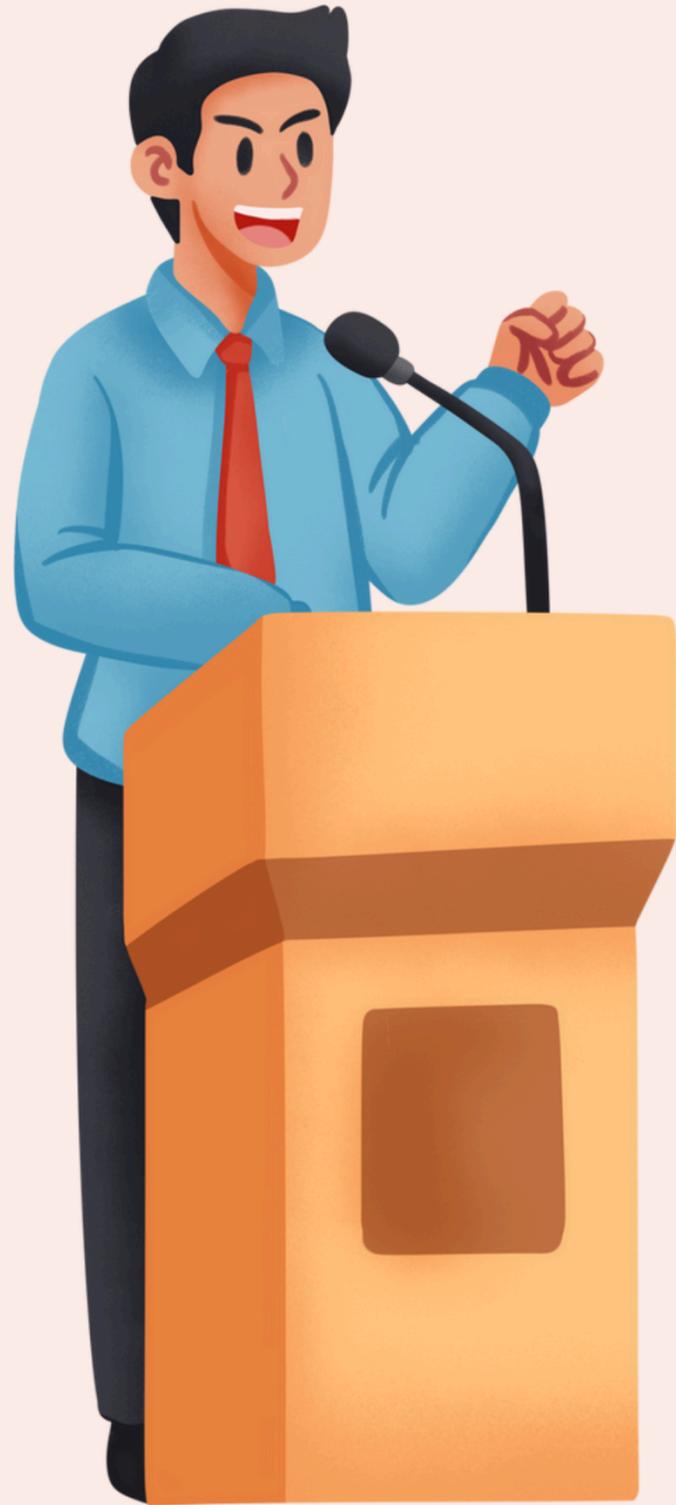

Democracy: Your Voice, Your Power!

Democracy means that people have the power to decide together how their country should be run. It is a system in which every person has the right to have a say, to vote, and to be treated equally. Leaders are elected by the people and must listen to them and work for the good of all.

The origins of democracy

Democracy is not a new concept! It all started in ancient Greece, around 500 BC. Back then, citizens would gather in open-air assembly halls to discuss issues and vote on laws. This meant that the power to make decisions belonged to the people, not just a king or a small elite group.



Some history

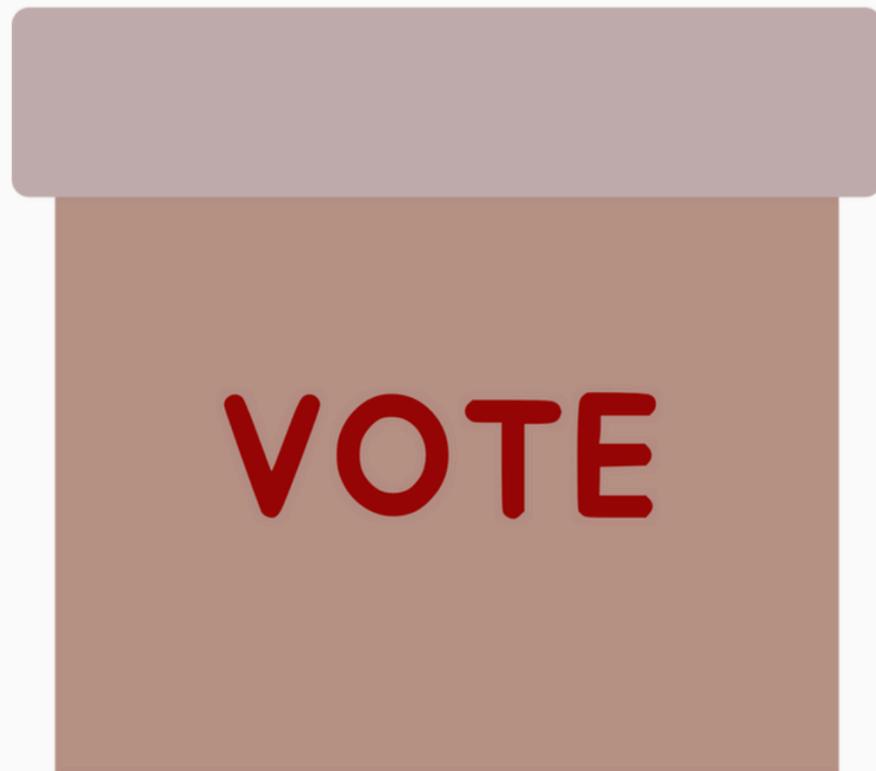


- Democracy has ancient roots, dating back to Greece around 500 BC. Citizens

Basic principles of democracy

- Equality: everyone's voice carries the same weight, regardless of background.
- Participation: citizens actively engage in the democratic process. Majority rule: decisions are made based on the will of the majority. Minority rights: the rights of those who disagree are protected.
